


- 3. Replace battery cover and screw shut.



#### **Remote Control**

- 1.Unscrew battery cover on bottom of controllers with a Phillips screw driver.
- 2.Install 3 AAA batteries with polarities as shown inside of battery compartment.
- 3.Replace battery cover and screw shut.
- 4.Choose channel #1 or #2 on controller power switch. (MAKE SURE YOUR CAR IS SET TO THE SAME CHANNEL NUMBER AS CONTROLLER)



5. EXTEND CONTROLLER ANTENNA FULLY.


#### **Derby Car Vehicles**

Unscrew battery cover on bottom of car with Phillips screwdriver.
Install 2 AAA batteries with polarities as shown in battery box.




### **OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS CONTINUED**

- Drive your Demolition Derby cars over the ramps, crash'em and smash 'em into the traffic cones and into each other. The body parts will eject!
- A head on collision causes the hood and doors to pop out. Car will stop operating after doors pop out!




• A rear ended collision causes the roof and doors to pop out. Car will stop operating after doors pop out!





- 6. PUSH GAS PEDAL BACK TO DRIVE CAR BACK IN REVERSE.
- 7. PUSH STEERING CONTROL TO RIGHT, CAR DRIVES TO RIGHT.
- 8. PUSH STEERING CONTROL TO LEFT, CAR DRIVES TO LEFT.
